Designed by one of Chicago's earliest architects, Edward Burling, the Samuel Nickerson Mansion is a beautiful example of Gilded Age prosperity. According to the Inland Architect of February 1883, the house "reached a standard of excellence never before attained in Chicago." From 2003 to 2008, the house underwent a meticulous period restoration, supported by Richard H. Driehaus for whom the museum is named. *Space is limited.*

In contrast, the intimate Perlman Sanctuary draws the listener in with the warmth and glow of artful stained glass.
